
Confidence in God

THE GREAT FAST IS HERE - A TIME FOR PENANCE AND METANOIA

Our parish will make a commitment to observe this sacred time in accord with the authentic traditions of our Ukrainian Greek Catholic Church. We will celebrate the Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts on Fridays at 6:00 p.m. in our Church. Wednesdays will be at SS. Joachim and Anna in Front Royal, VA. On Saturdays, we will celebrate the Divine Liturgy for the Souls enrolled in the Sorokousty 10:00 a.m. in our Church. Since ancient times, Christians have been challenged to practice: FASTING -ALMSGIVING - PRAYER - AS A WAY OF LIFE AND A WAY TO ETERNAL LIFE. Please try your best to make the effort to observe these Lenten Disciplines and Practices during the FAST 2022.

Everyone, regardless of age, is encouraged to observe the GREAT FAST as piously as possible!

SPIRITUAL REGULATIONS FOR THE GREAT FAST 2022

Although our Church traditionally prescribed abstention from meat and dairy products in days gone by for the entire duration of the Great Fast, the following are the minimal Lenten regulations today: Abstinence from meat and all dairy products on Good Friday. Abstinence from meat only on all Fridays of the Great Fast as well as Holy Saturday. It is also traditional to abstain from meat on Wednesdays during the Great Fast. Everyone should receive the Holy Mysteries of Reconciliation and Holy Eucharist during the period from the onset of Great Fast to the Wednesday before Ascension Thursday. The Fasting and Abstinence regulations are not binding on persons 60 or older, the very poor, sick, nursing or pregnant women, children below the age of 14, and those who engage in physically very hard labor. However, all are urged, if able to do so, to observe the fasting and abstinence regulations.

PLEASE SUBMIT YOUR SOROKOUSTY 2022 (LIST OF YOUR DECEASED LOVED ONES)

In the Ukrainian Catholic Church, it is the custom to remember our beloved dead during the time of the Great Fast. These commemorations occur on Saturdays because the Saviour of the world rested in the grave on Great and Holy Saturday, awaiting the Resurrection. Thus, Saturday became for Christians the day for commemorating the deceased, who await the resurrection on the last day. We will be starting our remembrances of the dead on Saturdays, beginning March 5, with Divine Liturgy at 10:00 a.m. at the Ukrainian Catholic National Shrine of the Holy Family, Washington, DC. Please take the time to remember your deceased family members on the Saturdays of the Great Fast. They hope for our prayers; and in turn, they pray for us. Please submit an envelope with your list of names and an offering is customarily made for the priests by email or US Mail. See the attached Sorokousty Form.

God With Us Catechism

The Faith of the Many sufficed for the Healing of the One

Today we hear the beautiful story of the healing of the paralytic who was brought by his friends through the roof of a building to Jesus, because they could get to him otherwise with the crowds. The Gospel tells us that the occasion for the healing of the paralytic, the reason why Jesus healed him, was that he saw "their faith." How powerful faith is! Faith not only has the power to unite us to Christ (as we noted last week), but can also save those for whom we intercede. All of us struggle in the faith; all of us stumble and become distracted by the enticements of the world. But if we are surrounded by faithful friends, we can be held up, and even saved from spiritual danger by them. Choosing good friends, then, is very, very important. They will either lead us to Christ, as the friends of the paralytic did, or they will lead us away from the Lord and endanger our salvation.
