The Work of the Holy Spirit



God With Us Catechism

"OUT OF HIS HEART SHALL FLOW RIVERS OF LIVING WATER."

Today we celebrate the great feast of Pentecost, fifty days after Pascha. And while we hear the historical account of Pentecost read in the church today from Acts of the Apostles, we also hear in the Gospel the promise of Jesus that those who believe in him will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit which will become a life giving spring which will flow out to others.

In other words, we who have received the gift of the life of Jesus within us cannot remain simply consumers but must become, like Jesus, a people who live our life as a gift to others. "For whoever would save his life will lose it; and whoever loses his life for my sake, he will save it" (Lk 9:24). It is in giving of our life, then, that the Christian finds his truth purpose in life.
