They All Ate and Were Satisfied


Our Lord in a desert place changed a few loaves into many, and at Cana turned water into wine. Thus before the time came to give men and women His own Body and Blood to feed on, He accustomed their palates to His bread and wine, giving them a taste of transitory bread and wine to teach them to delight in His Life-giving Body and Blood.

He gave them things of little value for nothing to make them understand that His supreme gift would be given yet more freely. He gave them for nothing what they could have bought from Him, what in fact they wanted to buy, to teach them that He asked them for no payment.

When it was not permitted them to give Him the price of bread and wine, which they could have done, they certainly could not pay Him for His Body and Blood.

Moreover, as well as giving freely He lovingly coaxed us, offering us these small things without charge to attract us and cause us to go and receive something greater and beyond all price. He awakened our desire by things pleasing to the palate in order to draw us to that which gives life to the soul. He gave a sweet taste to the wine he created to show how great is the treasure hidden in His Life-giving Blood.

TRANSFIGURATION OF CHRIST - Our Transformation

In our church calendar, there is one Great Feast falling toward the end of the Church Year which gives us the image of this reality [our final transformation] and actually celebrates it: August 6, the Transfiguration of Christ. His transfiguration in our nature is a preview of our own. It is as though the Father is repeating the insight given in the account of the Burning Bush. In both cases, He is trying to show what His idea of our relationship with Him should be (the purpose or goal of religion). On this Feast, we bless grapes and fruits as a real, tangible sign of Theosis. Grapes are the result of a long transformation, from the seed to the vine to the grape clusters. But further 'growth' is possible. The grapes can be transformed into wine, and by the power of the Holy Spirit sent from the Father, the wine can be transfigured by Divinity and become the Blood of Christ our God. Thus it transforms us.

Peter, James and John did not know what they were in for when Jesus asked them to come with Him one day. When they arrived at the mountain, Jesus was surrounded by light—His face was dazzling as the sun, His clothes radiant with light. The Father's voice said, "This is my beloved Son." To Jesus' left was Moses (representing God's Law) and to His right was Prophet Elias (representing God's prophets). On the icon are Peter, John, and James located below Jesus. The troparion for this feast emphasizes the light that Jesus brought into the world. We ask the Mother of God to pray for us so that Christ will let His "everlasting light shine also upon us sinners." We too ask to be transfigured by the "Giver of Light," Jesus Christ.
