God With Us Catechism

The Ukrainian Catholic Church celebrates the triumph of the holy archangel Michael and all of God's angels on November 8. Angels are pure spirits created by the Lord God to worship and serve him. They are the first among all creation, much more perfect than humans, and strong by God's grace. They are already saints and are the image of that perfection that we are only trying to grasp and to which God's saints have come close. Angels are close to God, surrounding him and standing before his throne. The number of angels is immeasurable. As the Holy Scriptures say, "thousands of thousands served him, and a mighty multitude stood before him" (Daniel 7:10). Saint Dionysius the Areopagite writes that the number of angels is greater than the number of stars in the sky, grains of sand in the sea, and leaves on the trees. All angels are divided into nine choirs, which are further divided into three ranks each: higher, middle, and lower. The highest order consists of seraphim, cherubim, and thrones. Seraphim, which means "burning ones" in Hebrew, burn with the greatest love for God. Cherubim, which means "many-eyed ones," stand near God's throne and know his secrets more than any other creature. Thrones are so named because God sits on them as on a throne to pronounce his judgments. The middle rank of angels includes dominions, who instruct the lower ranks; powers, who have a special power to fulfill God's orders and give God's chosen people the power to work miracles; and authorities, who have great authority over demons. The lowest order of angels includes principalities, who are the rulers and guardians of earthly states; archangels, who are messengers of God and evangelists; and angels, who are closest to us humans. Angels encourage us to do good, comfort us, watch over us, and pray for us. Every person has a guardian angel. Saint Augustine writes that God's love for us is so great that he has sent angels to care for us. Saint Jerome says that the dignity of every human soul is so great that from the moment of birth everyone has an angel appointed to protect them.
